Indiana Migrant Education Program Project

Description: The Indiana Migrant Education Program started utilizing myON as an educational resource for all identified migrant students in April of 2014. Purchased with Title 1 Part C funds, the goal is to provide migrant students with an appropriate literacy based program that addresses their unique needs and provide measurable performance outcomes. There are seven migrant regional centers across the state that help carry out and maintain equitable educational opportunities for migrant students. myON is utilized both in Regular School Year (RSY) and Summer School Year (SSY) programming. All identified migrant students have access to appropriate technology funded with Title 1 Part C funds in order to use myON within a migrant summer school program, a migrant camp, during the school year and at home. In order to provide continued educational services and to track overall reading growth, identified students can continue to access myON even if they leave the state at the end of the farming season.

PROGRAM GOALS

1. Provide all identified migrant students access to full functionality of myON with appropriate technology.
2. Provide ongoing customized professional development to all those who directly service migrant students to build capacity of components and possibilities with using myON as both an instructional and independent reading tool.
3. Using the embedded Lexile® assessments, monitor and track continued reading growth of all identified migrant students.

Most Indiana migrant students are here between the months of April through mid October. Regional Identification and Recruitment Specialists (ID&R) create newly identified student accounts and assign the accounts to one of the seven migrant regions. Additionally, there are specific LEA programs during the RSY within each region as well as multiple summer programs.

Project Management Services:

- Formal Project Planning with stakeholders including reviews and modifications as needed
- Data and solution setup
 - myON data - customized to meet the needs of the IMEP Project
 - Identifying enrollment process and procedures for new migrant students
 - Maintaining and updating processes based on communication from IDOE stakeholders

 - Schedule customized workshops and follow-up documentation with recruiters, MRCs, LEAs and TMC
 - Develop, plan and facilitate all customized Project professional development and materials
 - Written Implementation Plans before every Professional Development event
 - Individualized onsite Support at program events
- Data management
 - Develop and maintain ongoing process and procedures with recruiters and MRCs for newly identified migrant students
 - Manage ongoing student account transfer between building and regional classes in myON
 - Organize and maintain efficient structures for RSY and SSY rosters to support customized data needs

 - Custom reporting measures by RSY (monthly) and SSY (weekly) programs
 - Ongoing data analysis, monitoring and communication of project components
 - Yearly comprehensive report of program based on established goals
 - SSY and RSY programs

 - Measurable Performance Outcome (MPO) Lexile® level analysis by program

 - Establish myON point person at each site for capacity building
